Keynote Presentation

“The Medical Home” – Adam G. King, MD, MS

Caring for a patient's chronic medical needs is a complicated process, which requires many types of care providers to work together and coordinate goals and directives in a cohesive and comprehensive fashion. While having a primary care provider is necessary, it is insufficient to optimize patient care. Optimal patient care can best be achieved by utilizing a comprehensive medical and data record, which can serve as a common system for up-to-date history, referrals and subspecialty care. My discussion will focus on both current and future tools that can implement this type of optimized care.
