Admission Steps ([witc.edu/admissions](http://www.witc.edu/admissions)):

Associate Degree or Technical Diploma (Full or Part-Time):

Must complete all three steps.

1. Apply Online (include \$30 fee if applicable)
2. Assess for Placement – Take the Accuplacer assessment or submit other eligible scores
3. Admissions Meeting

Certificate: Apply (no fee) and Register for courses
