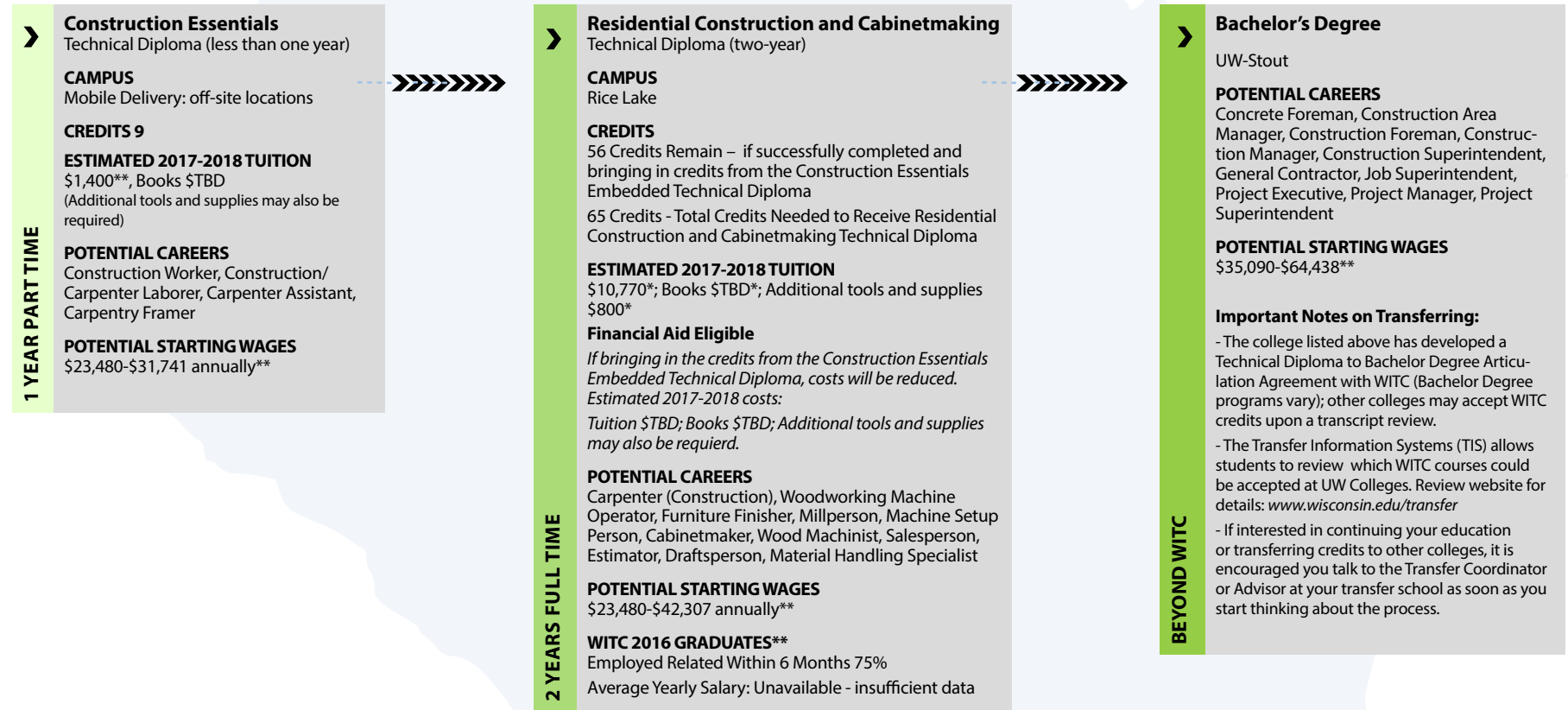

Admission Steps (witc.edu/admissions):

Associate Degree or Technical Diploma (Full or Part-Time):

Must complete all three steps.

1. Apply Online (include \$30 fee if applicable) at witc.edu/apply
2. Assess for Placement
3. Admissions Meeting

Some programs may have additional program requirements.

Take one class: Register during Open Enrollment (no application required). Depending upon the course, you may be required to assess or submit other eligible college entrance scores.

Certificate: Apply (no fee) and Register for courses
