Course Descriptions

EMT - Intermediate Technician - Credits: 2

This curriculum has been developed in accordance with the EMT - Intermediate Technician curriculum developed by the Wisconsin Bureau of EMS and Injury Prevention, 2001. The EMT - Intermediate Technician curriculum provides the same level of prehospital care as the current (1985) NHTSA EMT - Intermediate curriculum, which is under revision. Extensive patient assessment knowledge and skills have been integrated throughout the curriculum, as well as critical decision making. The Intermediate Technician will be capable of administering aspirin, 50% dextrose, narcan, atrovent, epinephrine (1:1000), glucagon, and nitroglycerine. Skills involved in obtaining intravenous access and fluid therapy will also be included. Participants will be required to participate in a clinical experience as part of their training. Field experience is optional, but highly recommended. PREREQUISITE: Admission to the program.
