Originates from **Prairie du Chien HS** (M-F, **YEAR**, 1 credit) AP Calculus AB is an advanced placement class that may allow for college credit or advanced standing when entering college. This course will allow you to challenge yourself to see what you are capable of achieving. Having experience with AP Calculus and exams can only enhance your chance of admission to a college. This will include intensive study to help students who are looking to major in the math, science, engineering, or business fields. Three Hour exams covering topics typically included in an introductory Calculus I college course. 105 minutes of multiple-choice questions and 90 minutes of free-response questions will be used. Both the multiple-choice and free-response sections contain parts where a graphing calculator is required and parts where calculator use is prohibited. Students will be expected to have a graphing calculator for use in this class. The TI-83 or TI-84 is recommended as this will be the type used for demonstration purposes in the class. Prairie du Chien runs a modified block schedule. Teachers will meet with their students 4 days a week due to one day being a block period. ***There is a seven-school day grace period for SRTNC classes. If a class is dropped after seven days, the school will be billed for the full semester.***

Originates from **Prairie du Chien** (M-F, **YEAR**). AP Calculus BC is an advanced placement class that may allow for college credit or advanced standing when entering college. This course will allow you to challenge yourself to see what you are capable of achieving. Having experience with AP Calculus and exams can only enhance your chance of admission to a college. This will include intensive study to help students who are looking to major in the math, science, engineering, or business fields. AP Calculus 10:30 am - 11:17 am

Originates from Hurley HS (M-F, **YEAR**, 1 credit: Grade 12). Prerequisite: Advanced Math
Course Description: Calculus defines and applies the derivative and integral functions. Derivatives are used to find rates of change, and integrals are used to find the net accumulation of change. Both of these functions are based on the concept of a limit, which is also defined in this course. Technology is incorporated daily into this class, and a graphing calculator is required. A strong background in Algebra and Geometry is recommended. Due to the cross-curricular content, it is helpful to take Physics at the same time.
